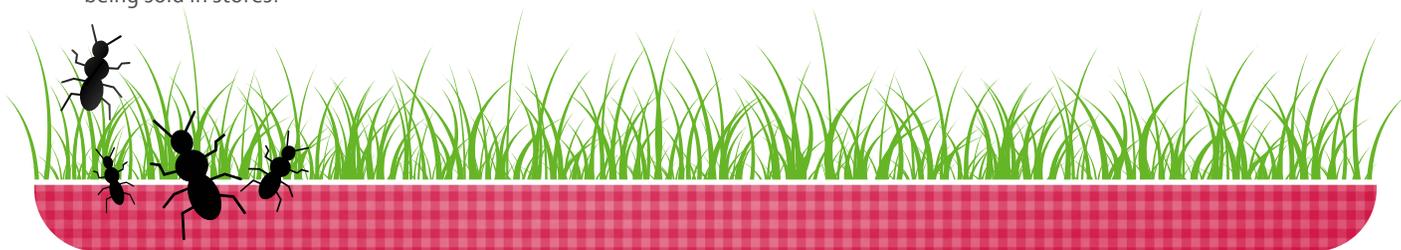
A Word About Weed

Weed is legal in Ohio. Sure, the Ohio Revised Code says differently, but check out the counter at the next gas station you visit. Dab cartridges, edibles, hell, even actual flower is available for purchase at most convenience stores. I'm not interested in exploring the "how" on these pages. There are countless articles out there exploring the ramifications of the 2018 Farm Bill and how the levels of different formulations of THC technically make it different from the widely known Schedule I narcotic. The reasoning is irrelevant. All that matters is that you can go to the store and buy it.

Why then must we continue the charade of its banishment? Why trick consumers into purchasing unregulated chemical concoctions that pretend to be weed? These substances produce a high, but any experienced smoker will tell you that it is not the same. If you are willing to allow Delta 8, Delta 10, Delta 11, THC-O, THC-X, HHC—even Delta 9, which is supposedly the illegal one—what are we doing here? For a state and governing party that drones on about financial responsibility, why forgo millions of dollars in tax revenue to uphold blatantly moronic prohibitions on a product that is already being sold in stores?

Some will argue that the federal scheduling of weed makes this conversation a non-starter. The United States government officially considers the substance to have "no currently accepted medical use and a high potential for abuse". After a grueling search through the kitchens of the Internet, I am pleased to present you with this month's featured recipe. As always, try not to think about the measurements and servings as a hard rule—improvisation makes for the best dishes!

Marinated Bald Eagle

Ingredients:

- ◇ Bald eagle meat
- ◇ 1 tbsp red wine vinegar
- ◇ 1 tbsp onion powder
- ◇ 1 tbsp garlic powder
- ◇ 1 tbsp soy sauce
- ◇ 1 tbsp honey

Steps:

1. Mix them on a metal baking sheet and put the bald eagle meat on it.
2. Mix the paste and meat so that it is heavily coated on all sides.
3. Preheat the oven to 350°.
4. Cover the baking sheet tightly with aluminum foil.
5. Bake the eagle meat for a minimum of 30 minutes.

While it is generally safe to eat bald eagle meat, you also have a rare chance of contracting bald eagle diseases such as aspergillosis and the West Nile Virus.

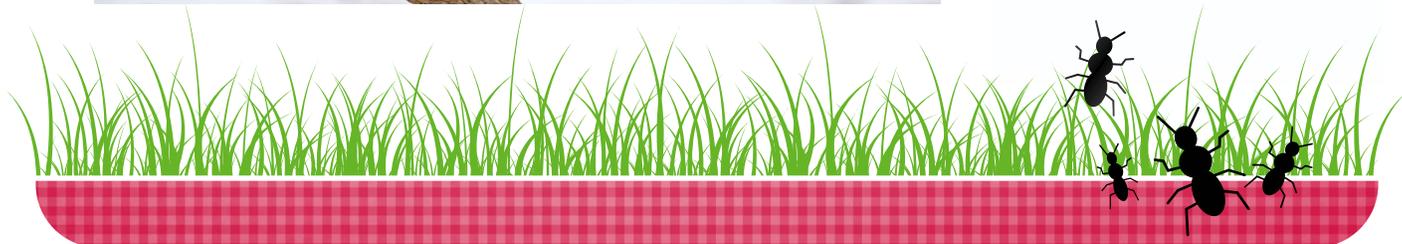
